Mental Health

Sponsored the Mental Health
Stigma Reduction campaign led
by The Wellbeing Partners and
Public Goods Project. The campaign
achieved a 10% reduction in mental
health stigma over a 10-month
period and gathered 127 personal
stories to help others feel
comfortable talking about their own
mental health.



COVID-19 Response

Partnered with Douglas County Health Department to provide early and ongoing access to vaccines in North Omaha. Administered **36,076 vaccine doses** over 55 clinic days. Cared for 1,124 patients with COVID-19 during the same time.



Food Access

Sponsored the Fair Deal Farmer's Market and helped the market become a Double Up Food Bucks participating year round retail site.



Housing

Provided \$125,000 in matching funds to leverage \$14M in state funding for affordable housing, with a goal of at least 72 homes built or renovated in the next two years in East Omaha.
